Have you ever dreamed of owning your own older home, but were afraid of the project size and potential costs? You didn't know what to look for or where? We will put those fears to rest by providing the resources needed to select, research, inspect, buy, finance, insure and rehabilitate your "dream" vintage home.

Dave Skilton, Tax Incentives and Design Review Specialist for the **Oregon State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)** will show us where the historic districts are and what that means to homeowners. Former Foundation staff member **Timm McBride**, **Realty Trust Group** will show you how to find that perfect house. Home inspector **Herman Venable** of **Double Check Inspections, Inc.** will explain the important process of the home inspection. **Don Lovell** of **Flagstar Bank** will talk about financing options, especially if the house needs some work before you move in. **Shannon Detroit** of **Chubb Insurance** will discuss insurance plans designed for vintage homes. **Cielo Lutino** from the **City of Portland Bureau of Planning** will tell you how to research a home's current taxes and zoning, and explain the local regulations of historic status.

Then, in our **second program**, we have assembled most of the resources you will need to make your home livable, presentable and hopefully restored to its former glory and comfort. **Monica Burke** of

Rejuvenation will demonstrate a soaking and stripping technique to save your original hardware. (You are welcome to bring your own hardware for discussion, but only the sample will be stripped). **Arciform's Richard DeWolf** will address how to coordinate large rehabilitation projects and keep them architecturally sensitive. Foundation Board member **Alan Hart-McArthur** of **Versatile Sash and Door** will tell us about saving old windows and doors, or if that is not possible, how to go about replacing them with correct materials and styles. **Jon Eaton** of **McCoy Stair and Millwork** will tell us about the woods used in older home interiors, and what's in stock or can be custom made today to match it. Master plasterer **Wayne Thompson** will show us that lath and plaster is still done, why it is better, and how custom cornices and ceiling medallions can be done onsite. **Mary McMurray** of **Art First Colors for Architecture** will get us started on returning your home's colors to a palette that blends and complements its age and style. **Charlie Becker** of **C. Z. Becker** will discuss your wood floors and how they can be brought back to their original beauty. **Lansing Linoleum's Kathleen Lansing** will show you how to save your historic linoleum, or if not savable, what replacement options are available today.

2004 Architectural Heritage Awards

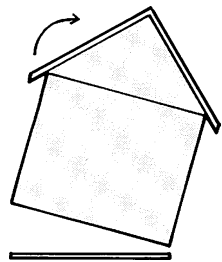

HISTORIC SOUTH PORTLAND

Lecture and Walking Tour

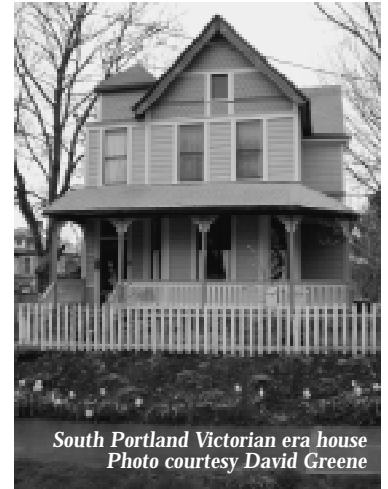

South Portland is a neighborhood with a rich 19th and early 20th century history, which included ethnic enclaves of Jewish and Italian immigrants and African Americans. By 1963 the huge "South Auditorium Urban Renewal Area" - Oregon's first urban renewal project - had cleared dozens of blocks in a large area that extended north, erasing landmark religious and community institutions, businesses, and countless homes. In the late 1960s, the planned "removal" of the Lair Hill neighborhood in South Portland was stopped by community activists and the high costs of clearance. However, the impacts of transportation-related projects hastened the isolation of South Portland south of I-405 and the loss of more buildings.

Despite the tragic losses, a number of Victorian-era houses and other buildings remain. Neighborhood residents **Stephen Leflar**, **Darl Kleinbach**, and **Scott Niesen** will present a slide-illustrated overview of the history of the area, and address the historic ethnic mix. Foundation board member **Jane Morrison** will talk about the neighborhood's architecture. Following the lectures, attendees will be able to take walking tours led by Jane, Education Committee co-chair **Barb Grimala**, and neighborhood residents. Historic Solutions for Your Vintage Home

Preservation craftspeople, architects, designers, vendors, and historians will be on hand under the big tent in Esther Short Park on June 5 to answer questions about your vintage home rehabilitation challenges. A new feature of the free event this year will be a series of mini-workshops in the nearby Slocum House, built in 1867, on topics such as preservation "do's and don'ts," and the landmark nomination process and incentives. The 1903 Chumasero-Smith House, located a couple blocks from the park, will be open for tours. Esther Short Park, donated to the city of Vancouver by the Donation Land Claim homesteader for which it is named, is the oldest park in the state. The Bosco-Milligan Foundation is coordinating the event. COLLECTIONS Training Opportunity

The Foundation has received grant support for a training, evaluation, and conservation program for four areas of our collections: **stained glass windows, hardware, wallpapers, and light fixtures**. We are seeking **up to 15 people per collection area** to learn from experts and work with our actual collections to inventory and evaluate their conservation needs. No experience is necessary and there are no "tuition" charges. The "qualifications" are interest and willingness to make a time commitment to attend weekend sessions (dates to be arranged), do your reading "home-work", and apply what you learn to assist us over time. The program will be scheduled during June - September 2004. "New Market Theater" Publication Available - In 1984, following the celebrated restoration and re-opening of the historic New Market Theater building, Bill Hawkins - architect and Foundation Advisor - published a small book on the history of the theater building (constructed in 1872 at First & Ankeny) and its environment in Skidmore/Old Town. Complete with a history of the 19th century theater operation, floor plans and photos, the book ends with the restoration of one of Portland's most important historic structures.
